DISCOVERY DAYS

ABSENCE / LATE / EARLY DISMISSAL REPORTING

All Absence / Late / Early Dismissal Reporting is recorded through SchoolMessenger which is School District 23's system for school attendance. Families now have 3 options on how they can report an absence, late or early departure to the school:

- 1. Use the "SchoolMessenger SafeArrival" App on your smartphone
- 2. Use the SchoolMessenger SafeArrival Website at go.schoolmessenger.ca
- 3. Phone the school and **push** "1" to report using the SchoolMessenger SafeArrival automated system (note: be sure to wait for your confirmation code or the absence may not be reported properly)

SD23 Appeals Procedure/Financial Hardship Language/Sanctuary Schools Policy

The Central Okanagan School District's Appeals Process Board Policy 460

Appeals states that, "A student or a parent of a student who is entitled to an educational program in the Central Okanagan Public Schools may appeal a decision of an employee of the Board of Education which significantly affects the education, health or safety of the student". For a complete description of the Appeals Policy, along with the recommended steps to follow in attempting to solve a problem, please refer to Policy 460 – Appeals, that can be accessed from the 'Policies' link under the Board of Education heading on the School District homepage (www.sd23.bc.ca).

The Central Okanagan School District's Financial Hardship Clause Within Board Regulation 425R

Student Fees (see www.sd23.bc.ca), the Board of Education has indicated "that a student will not be excluded from any educational program due to financial hardship". Clause 8.5 in the Regulations states: "Principals are directed to establish a procedure in each school which will allow for the private and confidential consideration of financial circumstances of individual students and families. Such procedures will preserve the dignity of families who may be unable to pay". Please contact the school Principal if you are facing a financial hardship that may restrict the ability of your child to access a school program.

The Central Okanagan School District's Sanctuary Schools Policy Board Policy 421

Sanctuary Schools upholds the Board's commitment to providing educational opportunities for all students who are ordinarily residents in the Central Okanagan, including those with precarious immigration status or no immigration status. Student registrations that pertain to Policy 421 – Sanctuary Schools will be processed through the Welcome Centre.



Accident Insurance

Central Okanagan Public Schools does not insure expenses for student injuries that occur on school grounds or during school activities. Parents and guardians can voluntarily purchase private accident insurance. The Kids Plus Accident Insurance Program that was previously offered to our students was discontinued in 2019. The IA Financial Group now offers the Family Accident Reimbursement Plan (FARP) which is a voluntary plan that provides coverage for students and their families against accidental injury, unexpected medical expenses, and critical illness. To apply for the Family Accident Reimbursement Plan or to find out more, visit the IA Financial Group website – Family Accident Reimbursement Plan.

Provincial Assessment Language and Policy Update

A reminder that the language we use to assess students' learning has changed this year in the province. The Provincial Proficiency Scale will be used to describe your child's progress on the learning standards. The link to the full Ministry document can be found here.



This language does not equate to letter grades, so it is important to know that the goal for children is **not** "Extending". If a student is demonstrating complete competency in a learning standard they are considered proficient.

Students will always be encouraged to take personal initiative to extend their learning. This looks like students reaching out to mentors and community members to follow a passion, researching and applying concepts outside of class, and innovating ideas out of empathy.
