Overview of what the PAC does, funding that is received and how it is distributed.

TREASURER -REPORT – Deannie Zahara (outgoing Treasurer)

- Gaming Grant came through \$15,700, and this deposit is not to be included in the Operational budget.
- Modular Farm loan has \$20,000 outstanding balance
- Previously, PAC funded 2 COBSS Bursaries, one for French Immersion alumni, and one for English student alumni.
 There is a \$50 administrative fee for this. A payment to COBBS in the amount of \$1,050 is Included on the proposed 2024-2025 operating budget.
- COPAC Membership fee \$100 is included on the proposed budget.
- Motion to approve Operational Budget as proposed. Moved by Paul Handhawa, Seconded by Tanya Miles. Voted in favour.
- Gaming Grant spending: Each year, Teachers and Administration provide a list of items/expenses that they wish to be funded by the gaming grant funds. PAC can also propose their own ideas. The gaming grant has stipulations as to what can and cannot be funded with the grant. Example: funds must be used for extracurricular activities. An invitation to submit requests will be sent from PAC to the KLO Teachers via Administration.

FUNDRAISING COMMITTEE – Stephanie Harland

- Volunteers for fundraising are minimal, so a minimum of fundraising has been done in the past. Those that raised
 the fundraising idea will be looking into the viability of the idea and will report back.
- At middle school level, there are lots of clubs that do fundraising, so the ability of the PAC to ask for additional donations is more challenging than in elementary school



COPAC – Steve Walker presented on behalf of Jennifer Dyson

- PAC is encouraged to hold off on paying BCCPAC dues for now, but should have the fees approved in our budget so
 we can pay them later if necessary.
- COPAC is involved in provincial collaboration with a number of other DPACs across the province, looking at the BCCPAC situation as well as trying to fill in the gaps left by the dysfunctional organization. As we are in the middle of a provincial election, we have focused some of our attention on how to elevate public education to be a more prominent issue for the candidates. A letter has been put together by parents from across BC, and it is part of the work done by our growing coalition of DPACs.

This letter will then be shared out via social media channels of various DPACs across the province and others from there.
