At the December 10, 2025 Public Board Meeting, the Board of Education approved the initial enrollment application dates for the 2026/2027 school year as February 2, 2026 at 7:00 am through to March 13, 2026. The closing date of enrollment applications, to apply the Board's enrollment priorities as established in Board Regulations 405R – Student Placement (Regulations) was set as August 27, 2026. Enrollment application information will be advertised and distributed through local newspapers, District and school websites, newsletters, and at school PAC meetings.

**Mandatory Parent Meeting:** **February 3rd, 6:00pm** in the Library Learning Commons


**Who can attend:** All grade 8 students are invited to apply. Space is limited to 32 students.

**Activities:** To begin, we will drive to Calgary and visit an Escape Room to exercise our skills of observation, critical thinking, creative thinking, and teamwork. The next day, we will move on to the Royal Tyrrell Museum in Drumheller and enjoy a day-long program learning about the history of life on Earth, dinosaurs, fossils, and the ever-changing conditions of our planet. We will "sleep with the dinosaurs" overnight in the museum and have another morning session before heading home. We will stop for brief food stops in Banff and Revelstoke on the way back.

**Cost:** The projected cost for students to attend this trip is \$480, but it is subject to change.

**HOW TO APPLY**

**PLEASE NOTE: The application process is online only. You are required to have a valid email account.**

**No internet access?** Please contact your school for assistance.

**Online applications begin on Monday, February 2, 2026 at 7:00 am.** Applications will be assigned a date-time stamp on a first-come, first-served basis, which will factor into a student's placement priority.

Complete the online application as early as possible, and provide the required documents listed below **directly to the school** in by email or in person by **Friday, March 13, 2026**.

1. Student's Birth Certificate or other government issued proof of age and citizenship.
2. Proof of Parent/Guardian B.C. Residency
  - a. Combination BC Driver's License and Services Card (copy of both sides); or,
  - b. BC Services Card (copy of both sides) and one item from the list of Supporting Documentation (3.) below; or,
  - c. Proof of application for BC Medical Services Plan and one item from the list of Supporting Documentation below.
3. Supporting Documentation/Proof of Parent/Guardian Living Address
  - Ownership of a dwelling or long-term lease or rental of a dwelling;
  - Documentation indicating British Columbia residence (i.e. utility bill);
  - British Columbia registration of an automobile;
  - British Columbia Driver's License (copy of both sides); or,
  - A current income tax return filed as a British Columbia resident.

**AFTER Thursday, September 3, 2026**

**New in-catchment area enrollments:** Parents will be notified by a confirmation email when the school has accepted the student's application for enrollment. Board Policy 405R – Student Placement (Regulations), will be used to determine student placement and priority.

**New out-of-catchment area enrollments:** Parents will not be notified until after the summer enrollment period is over and all in-catchment area students have been placed.

**Qualifying age:** The School Act requires that a child must be five years of age by December 31, 2026, to qualify for school enrollment in September 2026. No exceptions.
