OPENING WEEK INFORMATION:

- The first day of school is **Tuesday, September 2 from 8:55 11:30 AM** (School Bus pick up starts at 11:30 AM)
- There will be alphabetical student lists posted in the front of the school organized by grade. The lists will indicate the student's Homeroom teacher and room number.
- Students are asked to go to their Homeroom at the 8:55 AM bell. There will be many adults to help direct students to where they need to be.
- Students will receive their class schedule from their Homeroom teacher as well as review important information such as the Bell Schedule, Block Order, Code of Conduct, etc.
- We will start each day with a 10-minute Homeroom check in for the first week of school. Homeroom Teachers will support students with opening their lockers and finding their classes for the day to ensure everyone settles into the school routine smoothly.
- If students want to change their class schedules, they can pick up a course change request form from the office on Friday, September 12. Please note that course changes are a complex process and are not always possible. Requests will be reviewed during the third and fourth week of September.



APPEALS PROCEDURE / FINANCIAL HARDSHIP LANGUAGE

The Central Okanagan School District's Appeals Process Board Policy 460 – Appeals states that, "A student or a parent of a student who is entitled to an educational program in the Central Okanagan Public Schools may appeal a decision of an employee of the Board of Education which significantly affects the education, health or safety of the student". THE CENTRAL OKANAGAN SCHOOL DISTRICT'S FINANCIAL HARDSHIP CLAUSE

Within Board Regulation <u>425R – Student Fees</u>, the Board of Education has indicated "that a student will not be excluded from any educational program due to financial hardship". Clause 8.5 in the Regulations states: "Principals are directed to establish a procedure in each school which will allow for the private and confidential consideration of financial circumstances of individual students and families. Such procedures will preserve the dignity of families who may be unable to pay". Please contact the school Principal if you are facing a financial hardship that may restrict the ability of your child to access a school program.

SCHOOL BUS SAFETY



Transportation Services is advocating to bring attention to student safety when loading or unloading the school bus. Every day in our District (and many other districts across the Province) school bus drivers are witness to motorists who pass their school bus while the red alternating lights are activated, which means a student may be crossing the road in front of the school bus!

SANCTUARY SCHOOLS

Policy 421 – <u>Sanctuary Schools</u>

The Central Okanagan School District's Sanctuary Schools Policy Board Policy 421 – Sanctuary Schools upholds the Board's commitment to providing educational opportunities for all students who are ordinarily residents in the Central Okanagan, including those with precarious immigration status or no immigration status. Student registrations that pertain to Policy 421 – Sanctuary Schools will be processed through the Welcome Centre.

STUDENT ACCIDENT INSURANCE

Central Okanagan Public Schools does not insure expenses for student injuries that occur on school grounds or during school activities. Parents and guardians can voluntarily purchase private accident insurance. The Kids Plus Accident Insurance Program that was previously offered to our students was discontinued in 2019. The iA Financial Group now offers the Family Accident Reimbursement Plan (FARP) which is a voluntary plan that provides coverage for students and their families against accidental injury, unexpected medical expenses, and critical illness.
